Stormwater Program Plan Development

Municipalities and other public entities with separate storm sewer systems which service a population greater than 100,000 are required to obtain a permit to discharge stormwater throughout their jurisdiction. This permit requires the development of a “Stormwater Management Program Plan based on six (6) minimum management measures. These measures include the development of a Public Education Program designed to educate the public on hazards associated with illicit discharges, identification and reporting of illicit discharges, along with pollution prevention practices, waste disposal facilities, and recycling opportunities. The Plan must also include provisions for public involvement & participation, illicit discharge elimination programs, construction & post-construction stormwater management programs, along with pollution prevention and good housekeeping policies and procedures for employees.



Permit Applications & Reporting

arch environmental group team of stormwater trained professionals can also assist with your stormwater permit applications and all necessary reporting activities. The permit application includes a list of point source discharges, contact information, a map of the political territory including watershed boundaries and payment of permit fees.

Illicit Discharge Operations & Outfall Screening

Phase II stormwater discharge regulations require developing and implementing a plan to detect and eliminate illicit discharges to the stormwater system. An illicit discharge elimination program includes identification of all stormwater conveyances and structures within the jurisdiction, along with dry weather screening of all outfalls, testing of outfalls for pollutants, investigation of potential polluting sources, identification of “Best Management Practices” and development of O&M guidance documents for public employees.



Equipment & Supplies

Education & Training
